## ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The International Association for Conflict Management (IACM) was founded to encourage scholars and practitioners to develop and disseminate theory, research, and experience that is useful for understanding and improving conflict management in family, organizational, societal, and international settings.

IACM's 1996 Annual Conference will meet in Ithaca, New York on the campus of Cornell University. Accommodations and all meetings will be in the Statler Hotel -- a first-rate facility run by Cornell's School of Hotel Administration.

This year our keynote speaker will be Thomas Kochan, one of America's foremost authorities on labor-management relations and organizational change. The Lifetime Achievement Award will be presented to Anatol Rapoport, for his work on game theory and peace making.

Membership in the IACM is truly international. Paper presenters last year represented countries as varied as Bulgaria, France, Denmark, Canada, Israel, The Netherlands, Switzerland, Spain, Finland, Russia, Nigeria and Greece, in addition to the United States. With all conferees staying at the same hotel, leisure time and breaks are often as stimulating as the formal sessions.

## ABOUT ITHACA AND CORNELL UNIVERSITY

Ithaca, New York is located in Tompkins County on Cayuga Lake in the heart of the Finger Lakes Area of Central New York. It is surrounded by state parks, waterfalls, rolling hills, and magnificent views. In addition, it is within one day's driving distance of more than a dozen wineries, the Corning Glass Works, Niagara Falls, Toronto, and the Adirondack mountains. Ithaca is a small town with cosmopolitan sophistication. The county is reputed to have the greatest number of restaurants (including Thai, Caribbean, Chinese, Mexican, Indian, Japanese, Greek, Italian, Vietnamese, Viennese) and the greatest number of bookstores (new, used, antiquarian, specialty) per capita of any county in the United States.

Cornell University rightly enjoys an international reputation as a superior learning center. True to its founders' vision, Cornell today provides a place where the practical and the theoretical, liberal arts and civil engineering, agriculture and architecture, are explored and taught side-by-side. The campus is often cited as one of the most beautiful in the country. Situated between two breathtaking gorges, it also offers spectacular views across Cayuga Lake. While at the conference, participants will have access to Cornell's libraries, gardens, athletic facilities, and dining areas.



## Come Early, Stay Late!

It is easy to integrate the conference into a *super* early summer vacation. There are many wonderful things to see and do around Ithaca. For example:

You can hike Cornell's **magnificent gorges**, or jog along miles of trails in the **Cornell Plantations**. You can take in an exhibit at the **Herbert F. Johnson Museum of Art**, browse the **Campus Store**, or stop at the **Dairy Bar** for genuine Cornell ice cream.

You can view the planets at **Fuertes Observatory** – within walking distance of the Statler Hotel. You can birdwatch at the **Laboratory of Ornithology**, hike or swim at **Buttermilk Falls, Taughannock Falls** (the highest falls east of the Mississippi), or **Treman Gorge**. You can shop at the specialty shops lining the **Ithaca Commons** downtown.

You can visit any one of a dozen **wineries** along Cayuga and Seneca Lakes. You can return to **Corning** (site of our Rockwell Museum special event) and enjoy the **Corning Glass Museum and Factory Tour** (where they make Steuben Glass), as well as historic **Market Street**.

You can play **tennis or golf** at Cornell facilities. You can take a **hot-air balloon ride** in Newfield, or a **glider ride** near Elmira. You can see a **baseball game** in Syracuse – the Chiefs are a farm team for the Toronto Bluejays.

You can also **sit very still** – and simply enjoy being in one of the most beautiful regions in the Northeast United States.

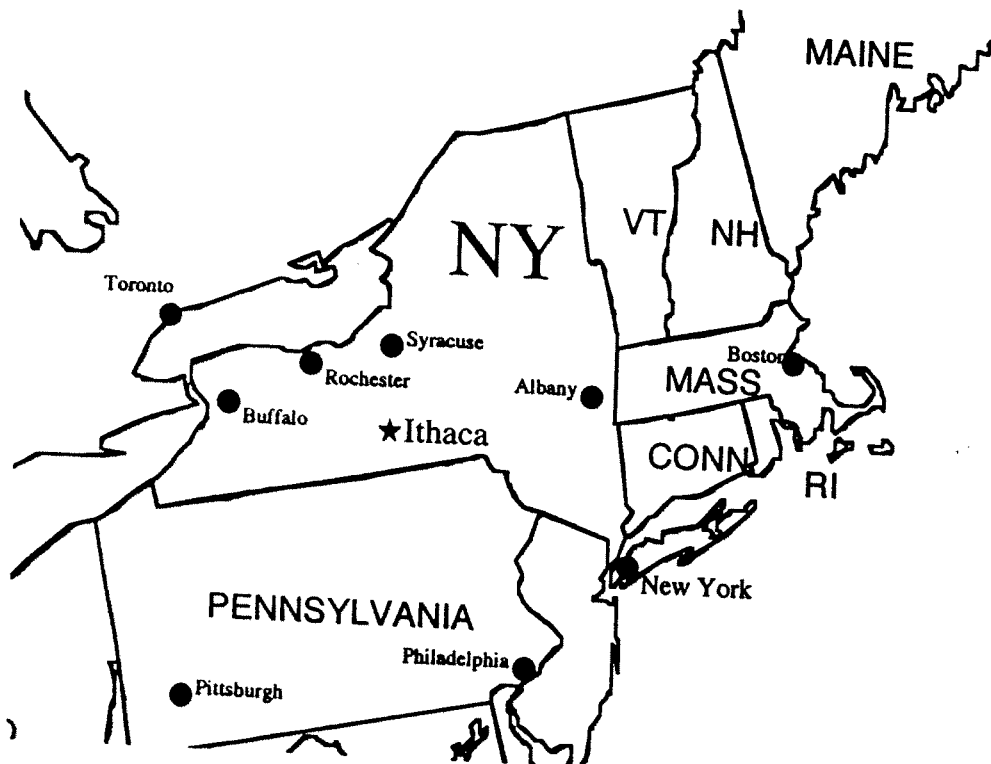

## Where IS Ithaca, New York?



Ithaca is located on the south shore of Cayuga Lake in the Finger Lakes Region of Central New York State (See Map). It is within 340 miles (566 km) of all major Northeastern cities. For example, Ithaca is approximately:

- 170 miles (283 km) from Albany, New York
- 340 miles (566 km) from Boston, Massachusetts
- 150 miles (250 km) from Buffalo, New York
- 250 miles (413 km) from New York, New York
- 200 miles (333 km) from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
- 60 miles (100 km) from Syracuse, New York
- 300 miles (500 km) from Toronto, Ontario, Canada
- 300 miles (500 km) from Washington, D.C.

## How do I GET to Ithaca New York?

### FLYING:

USAir and Continental Express airlines serve Ithaca's Tompkins County Airport (approximately 5 miles (9 km) from the University). Direct flights are available from the Syracuse, Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, and Newark airports. In addition, virtually all major airlines serve Hancock International Airport in Syracuse, 60 miles (100 km) north of Ithaca. Limousine, taxi, bus, and rental car services are available at both airports.

### DRIVING:

**From the South:** Route 1-81 North to Route 79 West, to Route 38 North into Dryden. Turn left onto Route 13 South. Follow Route 13 to Route 366 West (Cornell Sign). Stay on Route 366 onto campus.

**From Albany and New England:** Route 1-88 West to Bainbridge exit and then Route 206 to Whitney Point. Pick up Route 79 West to Route 38 North into Dryden. Turn left onto Route 13 South. Follow Route 13 to Route 366 West (Cornell Sign). Stay on Route 366 onto campus.

**From Rochester, Buffalo, and the West:** Follow the New York State Thruway east to Waterloo (exit 41) and take Route 89 south to Ithaca. Turn left onto Route 13 to North Triphammer Road Exit. Turn right on North Triphammer Road and follow signs to Cornell.

**From Syracuse and the North:** follow Route 1-81 south to Exit 12 ("Ithaca"). Turn left onto Route 281 South. Follow Route 281 to Route 13 South. Watch right turn for continuing on Route 13 in Dryden. Follow Route 13 to Route 366 West (Cornell Sign). Stay on Route 366 onto campus.
